Final Round Bench

In March, the New York Law School Moot Court Association hosted the 33rd Annual Robert F. Wagner National Labor and Employment Law Moot Court Competition. A record 46 teams representing 45 law schools from across the country competed head-to-head for the honor of arguing before the prestigious final round bench. The months of hard work put in by the competition Co-chairs, Gillian Kotlen 3L and Adam N. Love 3L, paid off in what was universally praised as one of the most successful Wagner Competitions ever held. This year's fact pattern, written by Shane Humphries 4L and Steven Sirota 3L, presented the competitors with questions arising from a challenge to the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), asking whether there is an automatic reassignment under the ADA and how a supervisor is defined under the National Labor Relations Act. In the final round, Loyola University Chicago School of Law emerged victorious over the formidable team from Northern Kentucky School of Law. The justices on the outstanding final round bench were:

# Message from Professor Susan Abraham, Faculty Advisor

This year was another year of great successes for the Moot Court Association—both for our teams competing all over the country, and for the competitions we hosted, Froessel and Wagner, for which our students wrote exciting and challenging fact patterns and which the organizers ran seamlessly. This is the first year in many (perhaps 11, I am told) that we had a team do so well in the regional competition of the National Appellate Advocacy Competition that it went on to compete in the nationals in Chicago. I am honored once again to have been associated with the students who worked so hard for the Moot Court Association.

This has been a difficult year for law students across the country as they watch the economy falling apart and the number of available positions for new lawyers decrease, and it gets harder now for the graduating students as they get closer to the time when they will be finished with school and the bar exam but may have no assurance of a steady income. Moot Court students have also learned to work hard to meet strict deadlines, to cooperate with peers even under extreme pressure, and to stand up to speak with confidence and poise no matter how they feel and what the external circumstances might be. I believe that these are the skills that will serve all of the Moot Court students best right now, when academic preparation may not be quite enough to get one’s foot in the door.

As the Faculty Advisor of Moot Court, I have happily written many letters of recommendation for our talented and hardworking students and will continue to do

so. I urge the students to use and showcase these valuable skills in crafting cover letters and getting interviews, to let perspective employers know just how much better their true preparation has been. And I urge all of the Moot Court alumni who share my pride in these hardworking, smart, and dedicated students, to reach out a hand with advice, support, and, when possible, even jobs, so these students can put all of these impressive abilities to work on behalf of their fortunate future clients.

I want to put in a special word of admiration for our Chair, Michelle Tonelli, who led the Association this year with the maturity and leadership and overall calm well beyond her years. I think we can all rest assured knowing she is going off to work at the Department of Homeland Security next year.
